• Dr. Kurt Hoffman, ACM's Senior VP of Instructional and Student Affairs, joined our meeting to meet our stakeholders and provide an update on the Technology Building renovation. Phase I of the renovations are complete and included several bathroom remodels, a new two story lobby, HVAC, and an elevator installation. Phase II of the project is fully funded and currently in the final design phases. The second phase work will include an extensive revamping of the entire floor space of the building and will include a suite of offices and classrooms exclusively for the Western MD IT Center of Excellence and P-TECH. The time line for the next phase is 18 months upon starting and is expected to begin in spring 2020.

• P-TECH Mentor recruitment, Melissa Kaye

We are still looking for computer science professionals who are willing to mentor students using an asynchronous online platform and who are willing to attend one event a year. While the students are earning a degree in Cyber Security, the mentor does not have to work in or have a degree in Cyber Security. We are simply looking for computer science professionals willing to donate a little time. Once a month for the 9 months of the school year, students will be given an online activity to complete. The mentor will then view the online activity completed by the student, provide some feedback, and continue the discussion. IBM has generously donated our access and use of Mentor Place as a safe place for mentors and students to communicate. Mentor Place will send you email notifications when the student has completed their part of the activity and are ready for you to view. There is no need to periodically check the site looking for what to do. Each activity will have an objective, business connection, student activity and mentor instructions to guide feedback.
